White Horse Morris will be returning to The Black Dog On Wednesday 15th July, from 8pm

White Horse Morris Men were formed in the winter of 1950/51 and were originally based in the Warminster, Wiltshire area. In 1951 they attended their first ring meeting at Oxford and were admitted to the Morris Ring of England. As their symbol they adopted the pre 1778 Westbury White Horse, itself a survivor of prehistoric times and similar to that carved above the hills of Uffington in Oxfordshire. The symbol formed part of the original kit with the White Horse badge central to the baldrick (crossed bands of fabric) of which the colours represented the area of Wiltshire, with green for Salisbury Plain, white for the chalk hills and blue for the sky.

Over the years White Horse Morris Men developed a reputation as an excellent dance side offering dances from a range of mainly



Cotswold traditions.

In September 2011 it was decided to make the side mixed, thus becoming White Horse Morris, so that they can now offer mixed and single

sex Border and Cotswold Morris Dances, thus allowing them to carry on their long tradition for excellent dancing.



Numbers are now flourishing and the style and energy that has always characterised White Horse has been maintained for the continuance of Morris Dancing in this area. Their dances are performed energetically, with plenty of audience participation! www.whitehorsemorris.org.uk

Focus Point

Rolling with the punches

Spring, which started cool, has begun to feel a little more like summer. Tisbury in its fine fashion has turned out to celebrate this change. Thank you to everyone who opened their garden on June 14th and to Elizabeth Young and her events team, which put on a wonderful event. Bless you all.

Heat from the sun was not the only place people focused on warmth. On the 5th of June the members of St. John's Church met to discuss the way forward for the making our church a warmer, more comfortable and welcoming space. It was a good and open discussion of hopes and fears and opinions. In the discussion, it became clear that being warm in church was a top priority. It was also very clear that people want to move forward. A more complete reporting on the meeting will be shared more broadly once all the comments from the opinion forms are collated. Thank you for showing such committed interest.

Change is not just important, it is the reality of life. Nothing stays the same, except for God's love for his creation and his people. Learning to adapt to change and using change as an opportunity to be challenged and to grow is both healthy and a way to thrive. However, I suspect that even people who spend their lives orchestrating processes of change find change a challenge and, sometimes, just plain difficult, but we do ourselves a great disservice when we seek to avoid or resist change.

When Moses first met God in the burning bush, and asked God who should he say was sending him to his enslaved people, God said, 'Tell them that 'I am' sent you.' In the Hebrew language, this can be just as easily translated, 'Tell them that I will be who I will be sent you.' We have in both these translations a sense of a God who cannot be pinned down to a simple identity and still remain who He is. It is a statement full of the infinite creativity of God, who is always reworking life to bring more life. As reflections of God, made in his image, we too are called to be creative to live creatively and allow ourselves to be remade.

The discussions about the reordering of the church building are about this. Our architecture does affect how we are and vice versa. Adapting 12th century building to be comfortable and useful to a 21st century society, while cherishing our inheritance from those who adapted the building for their times is both necessary and healthy.

The need to grow and change is also important for Donelle and me. I turned 65 this year, and while retirement is not immediately immanent, we begin to wonder where we will live when we do not have church housing. Additionally, I have now been a ordained for 11 years. In order to step outside of the daily work, and to reflect on what I do as your local priest and to envision how I might do it better, the Bishop of Ramsbury, has granted us an Extended Study leave. This was formerly called a sabbatical. We will be off duty for the better part of three months, returning in late October. We will be spending some time visiting family, but will also looking at churches who approach doing 'church' in unique ways to get a different perspective on leading a spiritual community. I will spend some time working with a work consultant to help me to highlight issues in the way I minister, and to discover ways I might better serve our community in the Nadder Valley. Many of you have asked me if I have written down the story of how God has brought me to being a Vicar here in England. I intend to spend a few hours each day reflecting and writing. Finally, I will be in the Kajo Keji Diocese in South Sudan for two weeks, helping to lead a conference helping the local pastors to lead their people better. We pay our own way, but if you would like to contribute to this important work, please place any offering, clearly marked 'CRESS' in the offering plate at church or give to the church office. Bless you all.

We are excited about this opportunity and do covet your prayers. Also, we are very grateful to so many of you who will pick up the load while we are away from duty in the Nadder Valley. Thank you. May God bless us all in ways beyond what we can ask or imagine.

Chilmark Clergy Notes JULY/AUGUST 2015

This month we celebrate our Patronal Festival at our Morning Praise service at 11.15 a.m. on 26th July. I do hope you will be able to join us as we learn more about our patron saint, Saint Margaret of Antioch. She is one of the less well-known saints and there are not that many churches dedicated to her, so it is good to remember her and to think about what her example of faithfulness can teach us.

Also in July we will be holding a special meeting in the church, led by the Chairman of the Diocesan Board of Finance, who will be speaking about the Share payments we as a church make to the diocese to support the Church's work locally, and to pay the clergy. Do come and join us on Monday, 20th July at 7.00 p.m.

At our Annual Meeting in July it was decided that most people preferred the 11.15 a.m. time slot for all our services, so **from August** there will be a new service pattern.

1st Sunday – Parish Communion – Common Worship in traditional language.

2nd Sunday – BCP Matins led by a member of the congregation

3rd Sunday – Family Communion – a shorter Communion service in modern language

4th Sunday – Morning Praise – a more informal, modern language service which can be different every time!

As always, the hope is that with this variety of services there will be something for everyone during the month. You will also see from the service rota that across the Team there are many different types of service, at different times – and you would be most welcome at any of these services if you have a preference for a style of worship that you find particularly helpful.

Whatever you are doing this summer, I pray that you will be truly blessed and that any holiday you are able to have will be a time of true re-creation. For those not able to get away, may you find equal refreshment in our own beautiful corner of Wiltshire.



NHS England - List Maintenance Project 2015

Over the next couple of months, the NHS is carrying out work in Bath, Gloucestershire, Swindon and Wiltshire to make sure that the patient details on GP lists are accurate. Letters are being sent to some patients, but not all.

If you receive a letter, please confirm that your details are correct or submit any changes. Changes can be made by returning the form in the prepaid envelope. If the details are correct, you can confirm by freepost, by Freephone, via text message or online.

GP lists do become out of date over time, and if we don't have an accurate record of your name and address, then we or a hospital may not be able to contact you with important information.

We might need to contact you:

- With test results
- To invite you for bowel, breast or cervical screening to protect against cancer, for example
- To invite you for a free NHS health check
- To offer vaccination against infectious diseases such as flu or measles, mumps and rubella
- To give you an appointment as part of your plan to stay healthy if you have a long-term illness.

It is important that you respond to the letter within four weeks, so the NHS can be certain about your details. If you don't respond, the NHS will assume that you have moved away, and begin the process to remove you from the practice list.

Thank you for your help with this.

Friends and Family Test: Thank you for your lovely comments about our surgery. We are

Confidentiality

Like all GP surgeries we take patient confidentiality very seriously We follow national guidance and comply with the requirements of the Data Protection Act (1998) and Freedom of Information Act (2000). We undertake online and in-house update training and regularly check we are compliant.

Giving out information. We only give information – test results for instance - to the person it relates to unless we know the patient has given permission or it is clear someone is acting on the patient's behalf (parents on behalf of their children). If you want someone else to receive confidential information about you, please let us know and we will update your notes.

Sending letters to patients We do not sent letters with confidential information unless there is no other option. We prefer you to collect from the surgery so we know it has been safely received.

Emails and web ordering. Emailing us is not a secure way to send information unless it is from another nhs.net account. We don't promote email consultations and prefer patients to avoid using email to order prescriptions if possible – the email could be hacked into and your information known to others. The web ordering service is secure and is the way to order repeat prescriptions online. The prescription screen only shows if you are on repeat medication. A request for an acute prescription usually needs a consultation of some sort with a GP or nurse.

Faxes. These are only secure if we are sure the fax is secure once arrived. Our fax machine is in a 'safe haven' so you can be sure of security at our end. We check the security of faxes we send elsewhere to ensure confidential information is not seen by those who shouldn't.
